A REPORT ON EDUCATION BURSARY FOR 2023 TO 2024 SCHOOL YEAR

INTRODUCTION

Tsogolo la Ana organisation is a local Malawian Non-Governmental organization that works with children towards promoting their rights and improving the livelihood of their families. With assistance from Open Hearts of Germany the Organization provides education bursary to the underprivileged children of Tsogolo la Ana Community Day secondary in Mpemba, Blantyre Rural. In the year 2023/2024, 40 students benefitted from this bursary.

IDENTIFICATION OF FORM 1 STUDENTS

- 10 new students (6 girls, 4 boys) were selected to be among the beneficiaries of the education bursary.
- A meeting with the parents of the children together with the beneficiaries was held to aware them about the education bursary. An agreement form was signed by the child, parent, TAO and head teacher agreeing on the responsibilities of each party.
- Every child received a pair of school uniform, a pair of school shoes, a school bag, a mathematical set of instrument, 10 notebooks, 2 pens and a scientific calculator.

SCHOOL FEES

FIRST TERM

• School fees for 40 students was paid.

SECOND TERM

• School fees for 40 students for 2nd term was paid.

THIRD TERM

• School fees for third term was paid for 40 students.

EXAMINATION FEES

- Examination fees for 10 students who sat for Junior Certificate of Education was paid to Malawi National Examinations Board (MANEB).
- Examination fees for 10 students who sat for Malawi School Certificate of Examination (MSCE).

• During this term we were in the process of selecting the beneficiaries.

• 10 (5 boys, 5 girls) students wrote end of term examination. All of them passed representing 100% pass rate.

• 10 (6 boys, 4 girls) students wrote end of term exams. All of them passed representing 100 % pass rate.

• 10 students (9 boys, 1 girl) students wrote end of term exams. All of them passed representing 100 % pass rate.

SECOND TERM

FORM 1

• 10 (6 girls, 4 boys) students wrote end of term examinations. All of them passed representing 100% pass rate.

FORM 2

 10 (5 boys, 5 girls) students wrote end of term exams. All of them passed representing 100 % pass rate.

FORM 3

• 10 (6 boys, 4 girls) students wrote the exams. All of them passed representing 100% pass rate.

FORM 4

• 10 (9 boys, 1 girl) wrote end of term exams. All of them passed representing 100% pass rate.

THIRD TERM

FORM 1

• 10 (6 girls, 4 boys) wrote end of term exams. All of them passed representing 100% pass rate.

JUNIOR CERTIFICATE EXAMINATIONS (NATIONAL)

• 10 (5 boys, 5 girls) sat for the national examinations J.C.E. All of them passed representing 100% pass rate.

FORM 3

• 10 (6 boys, 4 girls) wrote end of term exams. All of them passed representing 100% pass rate.

MALAWI SCHOOL CERTIFICATE OF EDUCATION

• 10 (9 boys, 1 girl) passed the national examinations M.S.C.E. all of them passed representing a 100 % pass rate.

SCHOOL MATERIALS

FIRST TERM

- Each of the 40 students writing materials as follows: 10 exercise books, 2 ball point pens, mathematical instrument.
- Form 1 and 3 students received a school uniform.

SECOND TERM

• Each of the 40 students received the following: 10 exercise books and 2 ball point pens.

THIRD TERM

• Each of the 40 student received 10 exercise books and 2 pens.

COMMENTS

- Initially the performance of the children on education bursary was not good despite all the efforts that were done ranging from, counseling, provision of food to remedial classes. We discussed with the head teacher on how best we can do it then we came up with an action of removing the student s from bursary who perform poorly. Previously we were just talking without intensifying it. The moment we started to intensify it, everyone is working hard to remain on the bursary.
- The time we had a meeting with the parents, most of them were

very happy to report that they have seen a change in their children. They

can see them studying and working hard so that they maintain their

position on education bursary list.

• We as Tsogolo la Ana are also happy to see that children on

education bursary are doing well in class.
